"20th" Anniversary of the 315AW Alumni Association

Our organization began 20 years ago under the leadership of Colonel James Bankers, Commander, 315th Airlift Wing, and now a retired Major General and past Commander, Twenety-Second Air Force. The first charter meeting of the Alumni Association began **9 July 1994**. During this meeting a set of By-Laws and election of Officers were established under the direction of **Public Affairs Officer Major Chris King** and the **JAG Officer Lt Colonel Andy Savage**. A copy of the documentation was filed on **8 September 1994** with the state of South Carolina IRS as a non-profit organization.

We began with **fifty-five (55) Charter Members**. Today, we have nearly 1,200 members and continue to grow. Currently our **20th Anniversary** celebration is still in the planning stages.

There will be no **45th Anniversary** celebration of the 315th Airlift Wing because of mission requirements and numerous other situations going on right now. Our **50th** anniversary celebration will be in year **2019**.

Charleston's C-17s parked by the White House budget

Currently a number of our C-17s are parked and regulated to "back-up inventory status" under President Obama's 2015 budget. Reduction figures were released saying the change would come if Congress approves the Air Force's proposal to convert the planes to secondary use. **Col Fontanella, 315th Airlift Wing Commander**, at that time, said Charleston wouldn't change under the administration's proposal; they would still be on the Charleston ramp and would be included in maintenance, inspection and repairs.
